He also presented information about Current Registration of IITAV as Incorporated Association and its membership growth over last four years. (a copy of presentation is attached).</li> <li>Dr Raj Rajakumar acknowledged the efforts of Committee members and thanked everyone for their contribution. As per Annual Statement presented, IITAV has cash reserve of \$5,839.97 which is confirmed by the Bank Statement dated 1<sup>st</sup> May 2014. The available surplus is \$4,989.97 as on 30 April 2014 after providing for liability of \$850 for Foundation membership in 2015 already received.</li> <li>Surinder Lamba also presented Revenue and Expenditure summary for 2013-14.</li> <li>Acceptance of the financial report was proposed by Nikhil Kumar, seconded by Sunny Chandra, and approved unanimously.</li> <li>It was suggested that IITAV should consider a framework for receiving donations from members.</li> </ul>   |

| 5. Member<br>Register<br>Update                  | <ul> <li>Rahul Tyagi, Secretary, provided an update on the current member register. IITAV has 58 financial members on the day of the AGM (17 Foundation, 40 Annual and 1 Corporate). This is almost 35% increase compared to membership number at the last AGM which was 43.</li> <li>It was noted that Foundation Membership of current members will lapse on 31 December 2015. The new Committee should look into developing a framework for different categories of memberships.</li> </ul>  |  |  |

| Planning discussion                              | Vice President, Ravi Singh, facilitated the discussion about two focus areas for 2014-15:  1. Membership growth 2. Enhancing IITAV Profile and Brand in Australia.  A summary of the points made by the attendees is below:  1. Membership Growth:  Promotion pack for use by members for marketing purposes will be useful.  Need further clarity on Purpose and benefits of membership to attract members.  Every member should bring in one or two new members.  Follow up earlier members who are no longer members.  Encourage more IIT-BHU alumni to join, noting that IIT-BHU is a newcomer to the IIT system.  Sub committees – One of them can focus on membership agenda.  Access groups like Yahoo group of IIT Kharagpur to identify potential new members  Social Media, Linkedin – make an active group  Phone calls - Personal touch will help; Members to share the task of contacting ldentify ways in which we can help members  Strengthen communication with members – more personal and frequent contact Develop platform for professional competency improvement.  Incentive for bringing new members e.g. 50% discount for introducing a member Retaining members - Discounted membership rates for 2 and 3 years (First year free)  Discounted membership for students (Note, we already have a free Associate Membership for IIT students in Victoria) |  |  |

## **Discussion / Action / Decision**

- \$50 membership is too low. Membership cost is not the issue.
- Make every member proactive, need greater involvement of general membership.
- Non-committee members to participate in teams and contribute to the activities and projects of IITAV.
- Extend Membership, noting that 170 (mailing list):58 (members) is a good ratio;
   Widen membership to institutes of similar standing e.g. IIM and IISc consider Associate membership.

## 2. Enhancing Profile Brand:

- Invite students from India, through Indian High Commission Provide facilities, platform to support.
- IITAV needs a physical home/office/building benefactor/s?
- Which group/s should we build our profile for? Which group/s do we want to attract? Organise specific events to attract them.
- Demographics analysis of feedback, attendance at events
- IITAV competing with other professional organisations.
- Should not dilute professional standard of activities.
- Bring High profile speakers.
- Need clear idea about our activities and focus areas.
- Hold events once a month on topics covering professional activity like entrepreneurship.
- Seek greater visibility through Media like The Age, Newsletter, Social Media, Blog, Twitter, Facebook, Indian newspapers, magazines, advertisements.
- IITAV members should attend Engineers Australia events and other events (like TIE?).
- Need to revisit Purpose –need paradigm shift to promote leadership and individual and professional attributes of IITians; facilitate greater contribution to National and International issues; Create platform to encourage IITians to aspire for and attain leadership positions.
- Supporting students form a subcommittee
- Use Motivational clips
- Reinforce request to all members to register their Profile on IITAV website so that we have a detailed database of capabilities and interests.
