# Converting Opportunity to Success the Indian engineering way

Melbourne, April 10: Indian Institutes of Technology Alumni Victoria (IITAV) and Engineers Australia (EA) jointly held a successful, well attended event in Melbourne on "Opportunity to Success.

Ms Manika Jain, Consul General for India



in Melbourne, Mr John McIntosh, immediate past President of Engineers Australia - Victoria Division, industry and academia representatives participated.

The Panel discussion was facilitated by Jordan Green, a Silicon Valley software veteran, Founder/President of Angel investor

group and a Case Manager with Commercialisation Australia.

He was joined by DD Saxena, Rakesh Aggarwal and Steve Bungay, Melbourne based entrepreneurs and IIT graduates who have converted opportunities to success in Australia.

DD Saxena, IIT Kanpur graduate, is the Promoter-Founder of Riverina Oils & Bio Energy Pty Ltd (ROBE) – with

an investment of over \$150 Million for oil seed crushing refining and animal and feed protein products at Wagga Wagga. It is the second largest integrated operation in Australia in this sector.

Rakesh Aggarwal, IIT-BHU graduate, is Man-

aging Director of the Saurin Group, who converted a failing milk powder plant into \$100 Million in seven years, at Langwarry Food Park in Victoria. The business was rated as the fastest growing private business by Business Review Weekly and has also

received the award of Victorian Exporter of the Year 2011.

Steve Bungay, IIT Delhi graduate, is Director, Envision I.T. Pty. Ltd. that develops software for entrepreneurs, SMEs and leading corporate businesses.



The broad ranging, vigorous discussion and Q & A session covered identification of opportunities and raising finance for early stage investment initiatives in manufacturing, IT and other value-adding industries which are facing a challenging environment

in Australia. The speakers reinforced the clear message that "to convert Opportunity into Success, an entrepreneur would need to go through steps like: recognise, characterise, evaluate, value, plan, exploit, share and adapt".

Jordan Green said that the "current Australian scene in the established sectors of Food, Manufacturing, Financial Services and Professional Services presented good opportunities for entrepreneurs whereas Cloud computing, Mass Customisation and the Internet of things are some new opportunities on the horizon."

Nikhil Kumar IITAV's event co-ordinator, introduced the Panel members. IITAV President Dr Raj Rajakumar gave a vote of thanks and presented IITAV's Certificate of Appreciation to Engineers Australia.



### 3.8 Annual report Focus Areas 2014-2015



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- Annual membership year is January to December.
- Option to subscribe to membership up to a period of five years.
- Lower rates for multiple year membership.
  - \$60 for 1 year membership
  - \$110 for 2 years
  - \$150 for 3 years
  - \$180 for 4 years
  - \$200 for 5 years
- An initial joining fee of \$20 in addition to the above rate for new members and renewals made after 31 March.
- Notice of policy sent in December and subsequent reminders issued.
   Policy has been implemented with encouraging results.
- KPI: Continuity and Sustainability: Several members have already renewed for outer years.




- Display of logo on IITAV website.


